



## Radford Highlanders (6-9, 2-3) at Birmingham-Southern Panthers (18-7, 10-4)

### Saturday's Game

Radford will make just its second-ever trip to Birmingham-Southern Wednesday needing a win. RU must win one of its final two games (at Birmingham-Southern, at Liberty) to host a Big South Tournament game. RU can also get some help to host. If UNC Asheville and Coastal Carolina each lose one during the final week of the season, then the Highlanders will back into the fourth seed.

Radford is coming off of a disappointing one-point loss to High Point at home. A win would have clinched a home game for RU, but the loss opened the door for either UNCA or Coastal to claim the home game.

Birmingham-Southern is coming off of a non-

Conference win over Savannah State. The Panthers last Conference game was a one-point loss at High Point.

BSC has been one of the toughest places for Big South opponents to play this season. The Panthers are one of the most talented teams in the League and have posted a 10-1 record at Bill Battle Coliseum. The only team to earn a win there this season was Coastal Carolina.

RU will head from Birmingham-Souther to Liberty on Saturday to close out the regular season against their arch-rival. The Highlander will then play in the first round of the Big South Tournament next Tuesday.

### The Series

This will be just the fourth meeting between the two teams. Radford beat Birmingham-Southern for the first time earlier this season, winning 57-53. RU dropped both of last year's games, the first to in the series. The Panthers were the second opponent RU got its first-ever win against this year. The other was Howard.

**Series Note:** Birmingham-Southern became just the second Big South team ever to win on its first trip to RU. Towson State was the other school.

Birmingham-Southern officially joined the ranks of NCAA Division I this fall, completing their transition from a member of the NAIA. The Panthers count in the Big South standings this year but the men's basketball team in ineligible to earn the League's automatic berth to the NCAA Tournament due to NCAA policies. Birmingham-Southern must wait until the 2006 Big South tournament until it is eligible, so for this year and next BSC will play the role of spoiler in the Big South while trying to build a record good enough to earn an at-large bid to the NCAAs, the only way they can get an invite to the round of 65.

#### THE COACHES

**Byron Samuels** has a 39-69 career record, including a 22-33 record through one full season plus this year with the Highlanders. He took Radford to the Big South finals last year, his first as RU's head coach. He has a 13-15 Big South record so far. Samuels, who spent two years as the head coach at Hampton, also spent time as an assistant at Tennessee, UNC Wilmington and Radford. He has faced High Point head coach **Duane Reboul** just three times, winning earlier this season and losing both of last year's meetings. Reboul, the all-time winningest coach in Birmingham-Southern history, earned his 350th career victory this year. He holds a career coaching record of 353-97 in his 15th season at BSC. He has coached BSC teams to two NAIA National Championships.

### Noting The Highlanders

#### WELCOME BIRMINGHAM-SOUTHERN

Radford and Birmingham-Southern have a very young series. The two teams met for the first time last season, with the Panthers winning both. RU won the first meeting this season. This is BSC's first year in the Big South as a full member.

#### STALEY RECORD

Radford hasn't played many teams from Alabama and when they have faced an Alabama-based team, RU is 1-3. Other than the three games versus Birmingham-Southern, the Highlanders lost to Auburn 79-57 during the 1984-1985 season.

#### FIRST TIME AROUND

Radford four players in double figures, and limited three of the Big South's top 15 scorers to a total of 16 points in a 57-53 win over Birmingham-Southern. Olumuyiwa Popoola and Whit Holcomb-Faye each had 13 points to lead RU's effort. Holcomb-Faye also tallied five assists. Chris Goodin scored 11 points and Aaron Gill had 10 points and seven rebounds to lead Radford on the boards. RU turned the ball over just eight times, tying a season low first established versus William & Mary. BSC's Grant Davis scored 17 points and grabbed 14 rebounds to lead all scorers. Jakob Sigurdarson, Derrick Williams and James Collins each had seven points for Birmingham-Southern. Sigurdarson, Williams and Shema Mbyrukira, who scored two points, were all averaging double-figure scoring on the season.

#### FEBRUARY FROLICKING

Radford has a great record in the second month. All-time the Highlanders are 147-86 in February, a winning percentage of .631 (not counting the 1974-1975 season, in which dates of games were not kept). Since 1998, RU has been very tough to beat in February, posting a 42-12 record, an incredible .777 winning percentage.

#### ON THE ROAD AGAIN

Radford will be back on the road for Wednesday's game and Saturday's game, their final two regular season games. RU is 3-8 away from home this season. The road has never been kind to the Highlanders. RU is 169-262 all-time on the road. In the last five years RU is 31-52 away from the friendly confines of the Dedmon Center.

#### TURNING OVER A NEW LEAF

One of the Highlanders' strongest qualities this year is their turnovers, or rather, the lack of them. RU has only given up more turnovers to its opponents four times this season. Radford leads the Big South with a +2.6 turnover margin, averaging 13.9 turnovers per game. They have forced opponents into 20 or more turnovers five times this season and more than 15 times 16 times. As a comparison, RU has turned the ball over more than 20 times just once (in a win over N.C. A&T) and more than 15 times just seven times.

#### WILL THE REAL KEVIN MARTIN PLEASE STAND UP

Radford assistant coach Kevin Martin has a VERY common basketball name. In addition to RU, VMI, Western Carolina and Wagner all sport a Kevin Martin in their basketball family. VMI's Kevin Martin is an assistant coach as well. Wagner and Western Carolina's Kevin Martins are both players.

#### WHIT'S THE WAY

Whit Holcomb-Faye, who leads the Big South Conference and Highlanders' scoring efforts with a 18.1 average, scored 37 points to set a new career high against Howard. He has had eight 20-plus games this year and has scored in double digits in every game but two (at UNCA and at Charleston Southern). Holcomb-Faye, who was the Big South's Freshman of the Year last season, is currently on pace to score 488 points this season.



## Noting The Highlanders

### BENCH POINTS

A big factor with a young team, the Highlanders bench has been a boon for RU this season. Radford scored 38 points off the bench, surpassing the 25-point output of the starters in the VMI win, a feat also accomplished against Virginia Tech. The bench played a role in the wins over VMI (38 points) Coastal Carolina (31 and 29 points) and William & Mary (27 points) spurring the victories. Overall, through 25 games, the bench is averaging 24.0 points per game.

### INSIDE THE WINS

Radford has some telling stats this season. The Highlanders are 10-0 when they have a better day from the field than their opponent and 2-13 when they shoot worse. The Highlanders are also 7-1 when they make more free throws than their opponent and 9-3 when they attempt more free throws. RU is also 7-2 when it outrebounds its opponents and 4-11 when it's outrebounded. And for a team that seems to be a magnet for close games, the Highs are 8-0 when they lead with one minute to go.

### STEALING THE BOARDS

Senior Aaron Gill has 425 career rebounds. He has 177 so far this season. He is averaging 7.1 this season. Gill has another stat to his credit though, one not usually associated with forwards. He's tied for first on the Highlanders in steals, swiping the ball 41 times this year. Gill is second on the team in field goal shooting among players that have played a significant amount of minutes, hitting 50.3 percent of his shots. He is also tops in blocks for RU, tallying 18 swats this season.

### HE'S A GOODIN

Sophomore Chris Goodin has developed into a premier offensive threat at Radford. This season he is averaging 10.7 points per game, good for second place in scoring on the team. That includes a career-high 19-point performance at Virginia Tech and three 18-point games (versus Coastal Carolina twice, VMI and Longwood). Goodin also buried an important three to help the Highs comeback against Charleston Southern and Coastal Carolina. He's drained 56 treys so far this season, shooting 43.1 percent from three-point range.

### THE MASK

Senior forward Matt James will wear a face mask for the remainder of the season after suffering a broken nose in practice two weeks ago. The injury forced James to miss the UNC Asheville, VMI and Winthrop games. Ironically, James plays on the club lacrosse team at RU, a traditionally rough sport. But it was a basketball injury suffered in practice that sidelined him.

### OLIVER TWIST

Freshman Chris Oliver is coming into his own as a Highlander. He netted his first career double-double against Liberty, scoring 10 points and grabbing 11 rebounds and he chipped in 13 points at High Point. Oliver's hitting 51.6 percent of his shots to lead the team, which includes the game-winning offensive rebound and lay-up against Charleston Southern. He is also second in rebounding on the team with 4.0 boards per game.

### EVEN EXTRA PERIODS

Radford is 1-1 in overtime games this season, losing 79-77 at Winthrop and winning 77-76 against Coastal Carolina. All-time, including this year, Radford is an even 18-18 in overtime games.

### NATIONAL RANKINGS

Whit Holcomb-Faye ranks 67th in the nation in scoring, through Monday's games, with 18.0 points (the rankings are released on a weekly basis). The Highlanders also rank 75th as a team in steals, 80th in turnovers per game, and 61st in three-point percentage in the NCAA.

### FREE THROW WOES

Radford continues to struggle from the line, shooting 61.4 percent from the line. What makes it even more frustrating for Byron Samuels and his staff is the fact that this team can and has shot well in a game. Versus Charleston Southern at the Dedmon Center, RU had it's best night of the season from the line, hitting on 81.5 of its attempts (22-of-27).

### RECRUITING FOR FOOTBALL?

Should Radford ever decide to start football, it needs to look no further than the Men's basketball team for its first two recruits. Sophomore Andre Bynum and junior Kyle Zaharias were both standout football players. Bynum, a quarterback for Ashbrook High School in Gastonia, N.C. threw for 1,414 yards and 15 touchdowns his senior season and was a runner-up for the *Gaston Gazette* Offensive Player of the Year honors. Zaharias, a wide receiver at Clover Hill High School in Richmond, Va. garnered All-District honors as a senior.

### WALKING ON FROM VIRGINIA

Radford has two walk-ons this season, Tom Hayes and Anthony (Penny) Brown. Brown joined marines after walking-on to the 2001-2002 team. He re-enrolled at RU this season and walked-on again. Hayes walked-on to the 2002-2003 team, practicing with the team but not dressing for games. Interestingly enough, both walk-ons are from Virginia. When you add that to the fact that former walk-on Matt James, who is now a scholarship player, also hails from Virginia, a theme begins to develop.

## Last Time Out

**RADFORD, VA.** - Danny Gathings hit two free throws with five seconds remaining to give High Point a 58-57 win over Radford Saturday night at the Dedmon Center. The win clinches a home game in the first round of the Advance Auto Parts Big South Tournament for the Panthers (16-10, 9-6 Big South).

Radford (12-13, 7-7 Big South) overcame a 38-26 halftime deficit and took a one-point lead with two free throws by Whit Holcomb-Faye with 15 seconds remaining. RU then trapped Landon Quick and forced HPU to call time out with five seconds remaining. Highlander senior Aaron Gill was whistled for a foul against Gathings, who sunk both free throws. Holcomb-Faye fired off a desperation three-pointer as time expired that was wide of the mark.

Holcomb-Faye led all scorers with 19 points. He was joined by Gill and Brandon Jeffers who each had 11. Gill also paced the Highlanders on the boards, grabbing 11 rebounds.

Zione White led High Point with 18 points, 17 of which came in the first half. Jorsua Chambers scored 10 points and pulled down six rebounds for the Panthers.

The Panthers jumped out to a quick lead, making a 13-0 run to start the game. They pushed the lead out to 16 on a jumper by Landon Quick. RU closed within nine with one minute remaining in the first half on a 12-footer by Olumuyiwa Popoola, but Brent Halsch drilled a three-pointer with seven seconds remaining to give HPU a 38-26 lead.

Radford exploded in the second half to close the gap, outscoring High Point 9-2 to start the second half, capped by a layup by Brandon Jeffers. Another run, this one 10-4, tied the game at 45 on three-pointer by Chris Goodin. The two teams traded baskets the remainder of the way.

Gill and Matt James, RU's lone seniors, were honored prior to tip-off. The game marked the Highlanders final home regular season contest of the year.

Samuels announced that Radford has signed Josh Fox, Colby Trent and JJ Coley to National Letters of Intent. A senior center at Riverheads High School in Staunton, Va., the 6-8 Fox averaged 15.5 points per game as a junior, while grabbing 9.3 rebounds and 1.4 blocks. A senior at Henrico High School in Richmond, Va., Trent will add more size to Radford's post game. The 6-8, 275 pound center missed his junior year due to a broken leg, but should pan out to be a strong low post player for the Highlanders. Coley, a 6-6, 240-pound forward, Coley averaged 17 points and 10 rebounds in his first year at Hillsborough Community College.

### Scouting Birmingham-Southern

Birmingham-Southern, despite the fact that its ineligible for the Big South Tournament, is doing what's needed to prove that they will be an immediate player in the Big South Conference.

Their only home loss this season came at the hands of Coastal Carolina, surprisingly in Birmingham, where the Panthers are tough to beat.

While they have no players ranked in the top five in scoring in the Big South Conference, the Panthers place four players in the top 16, meaning instead of having one or two star players, they spread the wealth around. They're also the only Big South team to have four players averaging double figures.

Jakob Sigurdarson leads BSC's scoring efforts with 14.4 points per game. Derrick Williams checks in at 11.7 point per game. And Grant Davis and Shema Mbyrukira average 11.9 and 11.2 points for the Panthers. That accounts for two-thirds of Birmingham-Southern's total offense. In addition, both Davis and Mbyrukira are ranked in the top five in the Big South in rebounding.

BSC is a well-rounded team that has the weapons needed to shoot down opposing teams. Radford will need to shoot well and limit its mistakes to earn the victory. Playing at the road will make it tough, so RU will need to have a great game.
