**MONDAY'S GAME**

Coming off a Conference home-opening win, Radford will look to move above .500 with a win over Charleston Southern Monday at the Dedmon Center. The Highlanders, which dropped their first Big South game to Birmingham-Southern last week, evened their record Saturday with a win over Coastal Carolina.

Charleston Southern, picked to finish dead last in the Big South preseason poll, has reeled off two road wins (at UNC Asheville and at VMI) to

take an early lead in the Big South standings at 2-0. The Bucs will try to move to 3-0 against RU Monday.

**THE COACHES**

**Byron Samuels** has a 44-79 career record, including a 27-43 record through two full years plus this season with the Highlanders. He took Radford to the Big South finals in his first as RU's head coach. Samuels, who spent two years as the head coach at Hampton, also spent time as an assistant at Tennessee, UNC Wilmington and Radford. He has faced Charleston Southern head coach **Jim Platt** five times, splitting the regular season games and winning a Big South tournament game in Samuels' first year. Platt is in his fifth year at Charleston Southern. Platt has an overall career record of 98-131 and is 42-72 at CSU. Platt was also the head coach at Arkansas Little Rock and an assistant at Florida State, Tulsa DePaul and Illinois State.

## NOTING THE HIGHLANDERS

### LONG HISTORY

Radford and Charleston Southern have a long history, but the Highlanders have come out on top in recent years. RU has won 15 of the last 18 games, prior to which the Bucs had won six straight. The two teams have tangled eight times in the Big South tournament, with the Highs holding a 5-3 advantage. That includes 2002-03 first round game, in which Radford, the sixth seed, upset the Buccaneers in Charleston to start a run to the title game.

### AN EXCLUSIVE CLUB

Whit Holcomb-Faye scored 11 points against Hampton to become the 21st men's basketball player to reach the 1,000-point mark. He actually reached the mark on the final shot of the first half against the Pirates. He now has 1,069 points to rank 17th. The last player to hit that mark was Raymond "Peanut" Arrington, a teammate of Holcomb-Faye's his freshman year. Arrington finished in third place on RU's career scoring list. Holcomb-Faye led the Big South Conference and Highlanders' scoring efforts last season with a 17.5 average, is averaging 14 points and 3.6 assists per game this season. Holcomb-Faye scored 23 points against Coastal Carolina, his first 20-plus game this season.

### ENTER THE TERRORDOME

Radford has an incredible record at the Dedmon Center. The Highlanders are 231-63 at the facility since Dec. 9, 1981, the first game ever played in the facility. This includes two perfect seasons (1993-1994 and 2000-2001) and five seasons with just one loss (1982-1983, 1984-1985, 1990-1991, 1991-1992, 1999-2000). Nicknamed the Terrordome in the early 1990s, the Dedmon Center is the second home to Radford basketball. The program opened in 1974-1975 in Peters' Hall in a gym that is now used as a recreational facility for RU's students and a secondary practice gym.

### CAREER NIGHTS

In every game but five (Birmingham-Southern, Ferrum, West Virginia, Colorado and St. Mary's) this season, Radford has had at least one player (non-freshman) set or tie a new career high in scoring. Chris Oliver (four times), Reggie McIntyre (twice) Brandon Jeffers (twice) and Ivan Wilson have all set new personal bests in scoring. Olumuyiwa Popoola almost did it against Ferrum, falling one point shy, while Andre Bynum was just two points shy of a career high against Colorado. Several players have also set personal bests in other categories as well.

### TRIFECTA, OR BETTER

Radford's offensive scoring has come from several different sources this season. The Highlanders have at least three players in double figures in 11 of its 13 games. Radford has had four players in double figures four times (against Yale, Longwood, Hampton and UC Davis), and five players once (vs. Lees-McRae). Chris Oliver and Whit Holcomb-Faye have been steady, tallying double figures almost every game. That third (and sometimes fourth or fifth) double-figure player has rotated between Olumuyiwa Popoola, Brandon Jeffers, Ivan Wilson, Chris Goodin, Andre Bynum and Reggie McIntyre.

### SEND 'EM TO THE LINE

One of Radford's biggest downfalls last season is now one of its greatest strengths. The Highlanders free throw shooting has shown marked improvement since last season when RU ranked last in the League in shots from the charity stripe. Radford is shooting 74.7 percent from the line this season, which places the Highs first in the Big South. It was one of the main reasons Radford was able to hold on against Coastal, sinking 13-of-16 tries down the stretch.

## NOTING THE HIGHLANDERS

### JANUARY JOLLIES

January is a kind month to the Highlanders, especially recently. All-time Radford is 175-110 in January (not counting the 1974-1975 season, in which dates of games were not kept. RU's winning percentage in the first month is .614. In the last five years RU is 33-20 in January, a winning percentage of .623.

### BENCH POINTS

The Highlanders bench, which was a boon for RU last season, is averaging 23.4 points per game through 13 games. The bench was most helpful against Longwood and North Carolina A&T, both comeback wins. RU's bench poured in 37 versus Longwood and 31 points, against A&T. It's highest output was 47 in the loss to UC Davis. When the bench doesn't score, it usually means a loss for RU, most notably the West Virginia game, when the bench contributed three points.

### OLUMUYIWA'S OFFENSE

It took a while, but senior guard Olumuyiwa Popoola finally broke out of a slump with 15 points at Birmingham-Southern. Popoola was one-point shy of a career-high on against Ferrum with 23 points, but between the Ferrum and BSC games, Popoola averaged 4.7 points per game. He had very rare back-to-back games offensively earlier in the season. He didn't score, (0-4 from the field versus West Virginia and 0-7 from the field against North Carolina A&T). Prior to the A&T game, Popoola not scoring was something that had only happened five times before and never in back-to-back games. Three of those five instances came in his freshman year. The Highlanders are 2-5 when "Doop" can't find the net, including the loss to UNC Asheville in the Big South title game in 2003.

### STATE OF THE UNION

Radford has an 94-51 record all-time versus South Carolina schools, including a 3-5 mark last year and a 1-0 record this season. Most of the overall record comes from games against Charleston Southern, Coastal Carolina and Winthrop, but RU has also faced other schools from the Palmetto State, including Clemson, South Carolina and College of Charleston.

### RADFORD'S NEW C.O.

Sophomore Chris Oliver set another career high Saturday, scoring 28 against Coastal. He has developed into a complete player for RU. Oliver set career highs in the first three games of the season, scoring 21, 23 and 26 points respectively. He's tied for second in the Big South in scoring and third in rebounding, having scored in double figures in every game but one to average 17.2 points per game. He leads RU on the glass, averaging 7.2 rebounds. Oliver is hitting 60.6 percent of his shots this season, good for second place in the League.

### NEVER-SAY-DIELANDERS

Many programs have the ability to recover from large deficits, but with Radford, it's almost a way of life. Nicknamed the Never-Say-Dielanders in the early 1990s, RU has a history over overcoming unsurmountable leads, including recovery from a 17-point deficit to defeat UNC Asheville and win the 1998 Big South Championship. The Highs proved that the Never-Say-Dielander spirit is again alive this season, recovering from a 21-point deficit to pull within four versus St. Mary's and a 15-point deficit to UC Davis to take the lead. RU also came back from a 11-point second-half hole to Birmingham-Southern to pull within two. Unfortunately, Radford was unable to finish the job, losing all three games.

### BIG MAC ATTACK

Sophomore Reggie McIntyre has made his presence known to opposing post players. One of the strongest players on the team, McIntyre has been able to push players around in the low post, even if they are twice his size. McIntyre has also developed a nice touch around the hoop, averaging 9.7 points per game. He had his seventh double-digit game, netting 14 against Birmingham-Southern.

### JETLAG

Radford is one of the few teams in the nation to play in every continental time zone this season. The Highlanders played in the Pacific Time Zone (St. Mary's, UC Davis), the Mountain Time Zone (Colorado), the Central Time Zone (Birmingham-Southern). Include those with the Eastern, RU's home zone and the Highlanders have covered the nation, temporarily speaking. Unfortunately, RU is 0-4 out of the Eastern Time Zone.

## FUTURE PLAYERS

Samuels signed two players during the early signing period, inking Stanley Pringle and Kenny Thomas to National Letters of Intent.

### PRINGLE

Pringle, a senior at Landstown High School in Virginia Beach, Va., will add even more depth to a talented Highlander backcourt. As a four year starter under coach Dwight Robinson, the 5-11 Pringle averaged 15 points and six assists per game and led the Eagles to the regional semifinals during his junior year.

"Stanley adds quickness and speed to our backcourt," explained Samuels. "He is a true point guard with a tremendous feel for the game."

Coach Samuels will be looking to bolster the talent at the point guard position with junior guards Whit Holcomb-Faye and Andre Bynum leaving at the end of next season.

"With the impending departures of Holcomb-Faye and Bynum, we felt it was necessary to bring in a point guard of Stanley's caliber," said Samuels. "He will be our point guard for the future, but he will also compete as a freshman for significant minutes."

Pringle choose Radford over North Carolina A&T and Big South foe VMI. He will come to Radford University in the 2005 fall semester as a freshman with four years of eligibility.

### THOMAS

Thomas, a 6-3, 190-pound Highland Springs senior will look to add depth to the Highlanders backcourt as well as compete for minutes. Under coach George Lancaster, Thomas helped lead the Springers to the Capitol District's regional semifinals as a junior.

"Ken is a big, strong athletic guard, somewhat of a cross between Popoola and Goodin. He is a basketball junkie, who not only loves to play, but loves to study the game. His knowledge of the history of basketball is impressive," explained Samuels.

During his junior year Thomas average 18.7 points, six rebounds and 3.6 assists per game while being named to the Capitol District First Team, First Team All-Region and Second Team All-Metro.

"We're expecting Kenny to help us right away, he's been well coached and his natural skills offensively should be a boost for our program," according to Samuels.

Thomas picked Radford over Georgia State and Boston University and will come to the school in the fall semester. Thomas joins Stanley Pringle as the first two signings for the Highlanders this fall. RU is 3-1 so far this season.

### NOTING THE HIGHLANDERS

#### AGGIE-TATED

Brandon Jeffers enjoys playing against teams with Aggies as mascots. Jeffers first set, and then tied career highs in scoring against two Aggie teams this season. He scored a career-high 19 points versus the North Carolina A&T Aggies, sinking a perfect 3-for-3 from beyond the arc. He then scored 19 versus the UC Davis Aggies, hitting on 4-of-5 from three-point land. Jeffers' contributions were more than points however. The senior grabbed a career-high tying seven boards against N. C. A&T, but more importantly, he drew fouls and made his free throws, hitting on a perfect 6-for-6 from the line down the stretch to seal the victory. Unfortunately for Brandon, there are no more Aggies on RU's schedule this year.

#### KEEPING IT CLOSE

The Highlanders picked up right where they left off last season with a one-point win over Yale. RU lost to Birmingham-Southern by just two points also. RU is 2-3 in games decided by five or less points this year. Radford played several tight games last season, posting a 5-7 recording in games decided by five points or less. The Highlanders were 11 points away from being 12-4 and atop the League standings. That includes a 3-3 record in games decided by one point.

#### YOU SAY ITS YOUR BIRTHDAY

Three Radford players have had birthdays in the last month. Duane Ricks and Reggie McIntyre each got a year older in December. Ricks turned 19 on Dec. 8 while McIntyre hit the big 20 on Dec. 23 (the day of the Colorado game). Josh Fox (Jan. 1), Andre Bynum (Jan. 2) each got a bit older and wiser, with Fox reaching 19 and Bynum hitting 22. In addition, Branden Smith will be 20 on Jan. 25.

#### EVEN EXTRA PERIODS

While RU has yet to play one this season, The Highs were 1-1 in overtime games last season, losing 79-77 at Winthrop and winning 77-76 against Coastal Carolina at the Dedmon Center. RU and Charleston Southern have played in four overtime games all time, with Radford holding a 3-1 advantage. The last OT game between the two was in 1995-96. All-time Radford is an even 18-18 in overtime games.

#### FOR EVERYTHING, TURN, TURN, TURN

One of the Highlanders' strongest qualities last year was their turnovers, or rather, the lack of them. Radford led the Big South with a 2.14 turnover margin one of only two teams with a positive turnover margin. This year has been a different story. Radford is averaging 15.4 turnovers with a turnover margin of -.58. The High only gave up nine turnovers versus Birmingham-Southern, while taking it away 13 times.

#### CONFERENCE HOME OPENERS

Radford is 13-7 all-time in Big South Conference home openers, including Saturday's win over Coastal. The Highlanders have won its last two League home openers, defeating UNC Asheville last year and Winthrop in 2002-03. RU and Coastal have only tangled once in a Highlander home opener, a double-overtime affair in 2001-02 in which Radford came away with a win.

#### HE'S A GOODIN

Junior Chris Goodin has finally settled into an offensive groove. The normally steady Goodin had been struggling to score, but his 11 against both Colorado and St. Mary's seem to indicate he's on the right track. Goodin broke the slump against Hampton, scoring 10 points on 3-of-6 shooting from the field.

#### HAYES SHOOTS AND SCORES!

Used primarily in a reserve role, junior Tom Hayes saw action against Ferrum, scoring the first two points of the season on a short jumper. His points against Lees-McRae marked the first time in his career he's scored in more than one game. Always a fan favorite when he plays, Hayes' jumpers electrified the Dedmon Center crowd.

### GAME 1 VS. YALE

**WILLIAMSBURG, Va.** - Radford men's basketball placed four players in double figures and used a strong defensive effort to hold off Yale 72-71. The season opening win Friday night came in the first game of the William & Mary Tip-Off Classic at William & Mary Hall.

RU sophomore Chris Oliver led all scorers with a career-high 21 points and seven rebounds. Junior Whit Holcomb-Faye had 16 points and six assists and senior Olumuyiwa Popoola scored 12. Sophomore Reggie McIntyre fell one point short of tying a career high with 10 points.

Yale (0-1) had a chance to win the game as time wound down, but sophomore Sam Kaplan's 18-footer missed and RU junior Andre Bynum corralled the rebound to secure the one-point victory, RU's second consecutive season-opening win.

Radford (1-0) broke open a close game to start the second half, using an 6-2 run to take a five-point lead with 18:56 left.
