Distinction Program and Excellence Award for Graduate Assistantship Holders

The Distinction Program and Excellence Award provide an *optional* pathway for ongoing professional development, peer support, and recognition to graduate assistantship holders (GAs, GTAs, and GTFs). Through the Distinction Program, graduate assistantship holders participate in events that assist them in their performing their duties and articulating the value of their experiences to future employers and other stakeholders.

Formal completion of the program requires that graduate assistantship holders do the following:

(1) attend training events as required by their supervising program

(2) participate in activities of their choosing that are sponsored by the Graduate College

(3) create an updated resume and post it in their Handshake account

(4) develop an ePortfolio in which they document and reflect on their development as a graduate assistantship holder

Assistantship holders who satisfactorily complete the Distinction Program receive:

- honor cords to wear during commencement
- notation of their achievement on their academic transcript
- an invitation to an awards luncheon
- automatic consideration for one of three Excellence Awards.

Winners of the three Excellence Awards (one GA, GTA, and GTF) are named at the awards luncheon and also receive a plaque and cash prize (\$500, \$500, and \$1000, respectively).
