- *Survey of Drama* (2012 2017, 2020 present) Overview of the canon of world drama encouraging critical reading and examining social, political, historical contexts of the works.

- *Porterfield Ensemble* (2001 2003, 2015 present) Rehearsal process class that culminates in a theatre production which tours to area high schools, middle schools, and community arts venues. Reworked previous ensemble format to fit development, rehearsal, and touring into one semester. Frequently involves writing/devising with the ensemble.
- *Acting I* (2000 present) Primary course in performance sequence with emphasis on stimulating imagination, awareness of self and basic components of acting based on Stanislavski.
- *Theatre Appreciation* (2000 present) Course is aimed at developing critical thinking through a look at theatre's function in history, society, and for the individual.
- *Voice and Speech for the Performer Levels I and II* (2001 present) Focuses on exploring and freeing the vocal instrument. Based in Linklater and Berry includes development of vocal warm-up, articulation as well as text analysis and IPA.

• *Theatre Appreciation* (2000) Class familiarizes students with the elements of live theatre including theatre artists, production procedures/techniques, the structure of drama as well as a brief history of theatre's development.

- *Introduction to Theatre* (1999) This survey class gave students an overview of the history and function of theatre in our culture by tracing from its origins to the present; also examined various aspects of the art.
- Beginning Voice for Performance (1997 1998) Beginning course for theatre majors exploring the free and flexible use of the vocal instrument. Included both physical and mental processes of vocal production for the stage employing the ideas of Linklater and Berry. Development of a vocal/physical warm-up, articulation, dialect reduction, analysis, and performance of text in class and IPA instruction were among the aims of the class.
- *Acting II* (1997 -1998) This class continued work begun in Acting I through exercises, prepared monologue and scene work, reading, play attendance, and writing assignments.
- *Acting I* (1997 1998) Primary acting class for theatre majors, dealing with basic elements of acting including imagination building, improvisation, text analysis for intention/obstacle/tactics based on Stanislavski and Hagen.
- Beginning Acting (1996 1999) Introductory acting class for non-majors provided students with a look into rudiments of acting, study of actors' technique and environment. Included scene and monologue preparation.
- *Voice and Diction* (1997) Class required for pre-law, secondary education, speech pathology and communications majors; covered the physical structure of the vocal mechanism, career speech, and organizing presentations.
