
Partnership Providing Access to Online Streaming



New Student Study Spaces – Coming Soon!



Grant Name:	Infrastructure and Capacity Building Challenge Grants: Capital Projects (NEH)
Summary:	Capital Projects support the purchase, design, construction, restoration, or renovation of facilities for humanities activities. This includes costs related to planning as well as the purchase and installation of related moveable and permanently affixed equipment for exhibiting, maintaining, monitoring, and protecting collections (whether on exhibit or in storage), and for critical building systems, such as electrical, heating ventilation and air conditioning, security, life safety, lighting, utilities, telecommunications, and energy management.
Eligibility:	IHEs are eligible to apply.
Dates:	Proposals are due by May 17, 2023.

Grant Name: Advanced Nursing Education Workforce (HRSA)

Citizen Leader Program Updates:

Why Be A Part of Citizen Leader?

- 1. **Boost your FAR** for teaching with a Citizen Leader designated course and/or for service with a Citizen Leader event or activity.
- 2. Sign up for a Faculty Partner for Fall 2023 YOU choose a student to support you in your Citizen Leader Course, a designated event, or designated community/civic engagement activity. Your student is paid minimum wage through the Financial Aid Office, but the Citizen Leader Program Office takes care of all of the paperwork. The student does not need to be in the Citizen Leader Program, although it is preferred. Number of available slots is limited.
- 3. We still have some **funding** available for events or activities. Funding is provided on a first come first serve basis.

Citizen Leader Designated Courses and minors:

We offer 20+ courses each semester and 6 minors. These courses impact over 1000 students. In addition, we network with New River Community College to better serve transfer students interested in the Citizen Leader program by designating NRCC courses as Citizen Leader.

If you think your course or minor aligns with our learning objective: *Make a connection between one's academic experiences/knowledge and one's own participation in leadership development and/or civic and or community engagement,"* please contact, Dr. Jean Mistele, <u>imistele@radford.edu</u>. Our aim is to keep the designation process to a minimum. Renewals occur every 3 years. However, we may email you to ask if your course will be offered for the upcoming semester.
