


Welcome and Retrospective

30 years of the Radford Student Engagement Forum (SEF). Thirty years! They say the only constant is change, and although this event has changed names multiple times and grown from a mere 30 student presenters to nearly 400 this year (despite a pandemic), it has been a constant that Radford University has been committed to engaging our students in projects that challenge them to grow and find answers

to questions that matter in our modern society. The "Annual Undergraduate Forum" (cover art for the 3rd program pictured, right) started with big objectives. Every year our students and faculty continually meet the eight original goals that range from the first, "encouraging awareness and recognizing exemplary student accomplishments" to the last, "showcasing and celebrating what is best in undergraduate education at Radford University." Building off of this proud tradition, and in support of the founding goals for the now Student Engagement Forum, I am excited to include the first annual OURS CARES Awards Showcasing the Best in Undergraduate Research during the traditional Thursday evening conclusion to the forum-as many call it. Maybe we shouldn't have changed the name so many times. But the name changes are a great segue into the history of the forum and how those changes are representative of changes across campus. The SEF would not exist without passionate professors like Moira Baker who found a way to mentor students and find funding to present at the



first ever National Conference at Undergraduate Research in Ashville, NC in 1987. Enthusiasm for bringing these experiences to more students was championed by Warren Self and brought into existence by Rick Slavings in 1991. I consider myself indebted to their vision for our university. In the early years the title changed to the Undergraduate Graduate Forum to include all of our students and a growing graduate degree portfolio and then to Undergraduate/Graduate Student Engagement Forum in support of our QEP. In this same time period, the Honors Academy became the sponsor under the guidance of Orion



Rogers and then for many years grew under the vision of Joe King. I have had the privilege of managing the Student Engagement Forum, since taking over from Niels Christensen in 2004. Niels was extremely gracious in offering advice, examples, and answering my questions in those early years. OURS has tried to bring new ideas every year to the SEF and this year we added the Lighting Research Competition and live virtual presentations. We continually push researchers across campus to think of the audience member and how we can best deliver information in a meaningful way. I like to think I've come a long way since my first research poster in 1999 (pictured left, for your amusement at the insistence of our GA Madison Ferst).

Etched in stone on the front of the Bonnie is the phrase *Investing In Lifetimes*. Throughout the last three decades, the Student Engagement Forum has been an investment in our students. This investment is well captured in quotes from longtime participants such as Melinda Wagner: "The Student Engagement Forum acts as a springboard to professional pursuits" and Susan Kwilecki "The Student Engagement Forum pushed already excellent students to higher standards." My hope is that each of you capture that spirit from interacting with the myriad of students presenting this week. Thirty years! As I look to the future, this past year of mastering—well ok, becoming accustomed to—zoom, wearing masks, and knowing precisely how far apart six feet is has made it clear I have no idea what is in store for the SEF, Radford University, or each of you. However, in seeing Radford University faculty and student teams find solutions to challenges, such as a way to adapt and carryout every funded SURF proposal where the majority of planned summer research projects across the nation were canceled, I know that the future is bright for the highlander family. I cannot wait to see what the 40th and 50th renditions bring!






