

# Radford University Transfer Guide



**The following outline of requirements is provided to assist students interested in transferring to Radford University. Core Curriculum courses are required for all degree programs offered at Radford and this cross-reference should make selecting transferable courses easier. If you have questions regarding a certain major's requirement not covered in this transfer guide, contact the Office of Admissions or the Academic Advising Coordinator for the Academic College in which the major exists. Please refer to the list of majors found in this guidebook for more information.**

## **State Policy on Transfer:**

To encourage the transfer of students from the Virginia Community College System (VCCS) to Radford University (RU), the State Policy on Transfer has been embraced by Radford University effective fall 1993. Students admitted to Radford who have earned an Associate Degree from a Virginia Community College based on a baccalaureate-oriented sequence of courses will be considered to have satisfied Radford's Core Curriculum requirements. The transfer degrees accepted as satisfying Core Curriculum at Radford University are the Associate of Arts, Associate of Science, and Associate of Arts and Science. Transfer credit evaluations are performed by the Admissions Office. If you wish to appeal a transfer equivalency or a transfer credit decision, contact the Admissions Office and be prepared to provide a course syllabus and/or official course descriptions.

## **Transfer students should be aware of the following:**

- To receive transfer credit, a student must achieve a grade of "C" or higher at the community college. A grade of "C-" or lower will not transfer.
- No fewer than 45 semester hours must be completed at Radford University. Thirty of the last 39 hours of credit must be completed at Radford University.
- 50% of the major must be taken at Radford University.
- As a minimum, 120 semester hours are required for graduation.

#### **All Students Pursuing Teacher Education:**

Transfer students pursuing teacher education must apply for formal admission to the Teacher Education Program during their junior year at RU. To be eligible to apply, students must meet the following minimal criteria:

- Completion of 45 semester hours of course work, except 50 hours is required for secondary education programs
- A minimum 2.5 grade point average (GPA) on all college work, a 2.5 GPA on all work at Radford and a 2.5 GPA on all work attempted in the major, except elementary education and secondary social studies which require a 2.75 GPA on all college work, a 2.75 GPA on all work at Radford and a 2.75 GPA on all work attempted in the major and in professional studies; applicants for the five-year programs, early childhood education/early childhood special education and special education/general curriculum must maintain a 2.50 grade point average in all above mentioned areas and must meet additional requirements for admission

- to the College of Graduate and Professional Studies
- Successful completion of all department requirements including a departmental screening examination (conducted at RU at time of application)
- Successful completion of EDEF 320 and/or HUMD 300 as determined by program requirements
- Passing scores on Praxis I, the Virginia Communication and Literacy Assessment and the subject matter exams (Praxis II) required for licensure by the State of Virginia (for full admission)
- Demonstrate professional characteristics and dispositions.

Students pursuing secondary education (grades 6-12) will major in the specific content area (for example, social science/history or mathematics) and should consult with their specific college. Students interested in Grades K-12 teacher education programs in Art, Music, or Dance, should consult with the College of Visual and Performing Arts.

Radford University has entered into the Pre-Teacher Education Admission Agreement (PTEAA). The PTEAA provides a common associate degree curriculum that can be used by any of Virginia's community colleges to prepare students to transfer to RU. RU's teacher education programs included in the PTEAA agreement are: Elementary Education (PreK-6), Middle School Education (6-8), Early Childhood Education (PreK-3)/Early Childhood Special Education (birth through age five), and Special Education-High Incidence Disabilities. Students in the Early Childhood Education/Early Childhood Special Education and the Special Education-General Curriculum must complete the five year MS program in order to be recommended for licensure.
