The Fall 2005 Graduate Program Profiles report should be useful as you consider your program's strengths, plan recruitment efforts, and manage enrollments.

This report reflects the 1,101 students that were enrolled on September 5, 2005 (the official census date). This figure differs from the official number of 1,070 that is reported to SCHEV by the Office of Institutional Research. The discrepancy is caused by the fact that while this report counts auditing<sup>1</sup> and fee waiver<sup>2</sup> students, the official number cannot include those students. Nevertheless, this report reflects all students that are enrolled in a graduate level class for Fall 2005 at census.

All figures throughout this report (except where noted) reflect application and enrollment data for the Fall term only. One notable exception is the data for graduate degree conferrals (Table 12), which reflect the academic year from the fall term to the summer term of the next calendar year. For example, the data under "2004-2005" represents degrees awarded from Fall 2004 through Summer 2005. Both applications and enrollment for Fall 2005 have increased over the last year; including applications for special non-degree programs and licensure/professional certification, applications have increased 26.2% since Fall 2004 and enrollment has increased 13.2% in that same period.

Thanks go to Richard Tillies, II (Database Specialist, CGEE) and Debra Templeton (Office of Institutional Research) who provided the data for this report. Richard and Graduate Assistant Greg Kobus compiled and created the tables. Of course, without the contributions you, as graduate faculty members, make to Radford University's graduate education, there would be nothing to report. Thank you for your time and dedication to your programs and to your students.
