### **Update** on AALT

- On the budget savings plan, all faculty professional development leaves (FPDL) for Spring, 2015 are going forward. There will be a call for FPDL for the 2015-2016 academic year.
- 100% of the annual faculty travel support is being restored to departments/schools.
- Research monies to be restored for the colleges. The applications for research award requests that were submitted August 15, 2014 had been placed on hold due to the budget and will now move forward in the review process.
- Provost's recruitment and retention initiative: \$5000 to bring high school counselors on campus to talk about our programs.
- Midterm grades Please encourage faculty to give midterm grades to new freshman, new transfer students, student athletes and students on academic probation. Academic advisors use midterm grades to help to identify students who need additional support and guidance. Academic advisors do not have access to D2L, so if faculty members do not enter midterm grades, the academic advisors will not be able to identify those students having difficulty. Midterms for Fall, 2014 are due by 10am on Wed, Oct 8<sup>th</sup>.
- Reappointment/Tenure and/or Promotion When a letter is sent from the Dean to the Department Chair/School Director and Personnel Committee Chair that letter should be forwarded to all the Personnel Committee members. Letters from the Department Chairs/School Director to the dean also need to be distributed to the Personnel Committee. There should be no

- confidential personnel matters discussed outside of official Personnel Committee deliberations.
- Reminder re/IRB (Institutional Review Board) review: Anyone conducting research involving human subjects must go through the required IRB training. All research involving human subjects must be submitted for IRB review. The IRB staff and faculty are currently in the process of finalizing a recommendation regarding the selection of new IRB software.
