

Please submit your nominations through the <u>Award Nomination Form</u> by February 19th (Wednesday), 2025.



### **General Education Improvement Task Force UPDATE**

From February 12 to 19, the General Education Improvement Task Force will be holding Town Halls with each college and one in Roanoke. On February 11, Faculty Senate will send an email to all faculty with updated drafts of the general education model.

We have listened to the feedback from faculty and staff (thank you for the feedback!) and have continued to work on the model. In these sessions, your college rep, the Faculty Senate rep, and the chair will discuss the updated draft of a general education model and elicit more feedback from the faculty. We also plan to have sessions with students.

After completing the town halls, the Task Force will convene to discuss the feedback and make any necessary revisions. Our recommendation will be delivered to the Faculty Senate and the Provost on February 21.

We look forward to our continuing discussion on general education.

# **Starfish Progress Report Opens Monday, Feb 10**

The **Week 4 Progress Report**, facilitated through **Starfish**, allows faculty to quickly raise **Academic Performance Flags** and submit referrals to campus support services. These flags enable early intervention for students facing academic challenges. Referrals connect students with vital campus resources and support.

The Week 4 Progress Report will include students in all **100- and 200-level courses**. By prioritizing these foundational courses, we can strategically provide support to strengthen students' academic success during a pivotal time in the semester. However, instructors of any course can manually raise flags and submit referrals at any time during the semester.

### Tracking Items included on the Week 4 Progress Report:

- Keep Up the Good Work Kudo Provides a "pat on the back" for students who are doing well
- <u>Academic Performance Flag</u> Alert students about attendance concerns, missing or late assignments, low online participation, low grades, or any concern related to their academic performance. This flag is intended as communication between the flag raiser and the student, but it can be paired with referrals to campus partners for resources and support. Students are notified about this flag and the message will include instructor comments. Students with multiple Academic Performance Flags will be contacted by the Highlander Success Center.
- <u>Academic Advising Referral</u> Use this referral if a student needs assistance with academic policy, course withdrawal, or other advising processes or questions.

- <u>Peer Academic Coaching Referral</u> Use this to refer a student who may benefit from peer coaching and mentoring regarding time management, study skills, organization, goal setting, motivation, etc.
- <u>Tutoring or Writing Assistance Referral</u> Use this if a student needs additional help in a specific course or subject area. If the referral is specifically for writing assistance, please specify the student's needs.
