Office of the Registrar News

The Radford University's Office of the Registrar is pleased to announce the launch of a new electronic Faculty Grade Change form, available to all academic departments starting Monday, December 16, 2024. This new digital form, powered by Kuali Build, replaces the former paper form and the emailed submissions, allowing departments to streamline grade changes, reduce paperwork, and track requests in real-time.

The new form can be accessed conveniently through OneCampus by searching "Grade Change Form." Designed to simplify workflows, the electronic form routes requests through an automated approval process, sending an automatic email confirmation to the student and the instructor once the Registrar's Office has processed the request.
