Open Access Article Publishing without the Author Publishing Costs (APCs)

If you are planning to submit an article to a scholarly journal, check to see if we have an agreement with the publisher before submitting. If you follow the guidelines under these agreements, you may be able to publish open access with no author publishing costs (APCs) in select journals published by Wiley, Cambridge, and more, reaching a broader audience and supporting open science, by allowing readers to access your article for free online. This program is through the Radford University Libraries' membership in VIVA, the Virginia Academic Libraries Consortium. Private Funding Opportunities

Jeffress Trust Foundation https://hria.org/grants/jeffress/

The Jeffress Trust program focuses on research addressing the root causes of and systemic barriers to health equity for the state of Virginia. The shift in funding priority was made after an intensive landscape assessment of the health needs and funding initiatives available to Virginia. The Program provides funding to support research activities in Policy, Systems, and Environmental change strategies (PSE strategies) Analysis, Program/Practice Analysis, and General Research.

Commonwealth Health Research Board https://chrb.org/

The Commonwealth Health Research Board (CHRB) was established as an independent body to provide financial support from the Commonwealth Health Research Fund in the form of grants, donations, or other assistance, for research efforts that have the potential of maximizing human health benefits for the citizens of the Commonwealth.

The Spencer Foundation has been a leading funder of education research since 1971 and is the only national foundation focused exclusively on supporting education research. Their goals are to:

- Invest in education research that is transformative, methodologically rigorous, and helps create a better society.

- Strengthen the impact of education research for improving educational practice.
- Make education research more accessible to public audiences.

The Virginia Foundation for the Humanities https://virginiahumanities.org/

The Foundation shares the stories of all Virginians—or, better yet, find ways for people to share their own stories. They want Virginians to connect with their history and culture and, in doing that, they hope we will all better understand one another. Founded in 1974, they are one of fifty-six humanities councils created by the US Congress with money and support from the National Endowment for the Humanities (www.neh.gov) to make the humanities available to all Americans.

The Virginia Commission for the Arts https://vca.virginia.gov/grants/

Established in 1968, the VCA is the state agency dedicated to investing in the arts of Virginia. Through allocations made possible by the National Endowment for the Arts (www.nea.gov) and the General Assembly, the VCA utilizes investments to empower arts leaders, arts educators, and arts practitioners. In doing so, they create a virtuous cycle of those who not just participate in and appreciate the arts, as stated in our enabling legislation, but those who serve as change agents and advance the Commonwealth of Virginia. VCA offers three different types of funding options.

Project Based: These grants build strong collaborations with arts organizations and Virginia municipalities, providing unrestricted funding to support their missions.

Impact Grants: These grants offer project-based funding to drive meaningful change through the arts, enriching communities and educational institutions across the state; OR

Artist Roster Engagement: These non-competitive, rolling grants leverage the Artist Rosters to connect Virginia organizations and schools with accomplished teaching and performing artists.

This program features faculty development for incorporating course-based undergraduate research experiences (CURES) into a course and partners faculty with paid talented undergraduate students who serve as "research mentors" to their students. Faculty members would be joining a group of dedicated teacher-scholars focused on elevating the equity-minded pedagogy of undergraduate research, scholarship, and creative inquiry (URSCI) and broadening impacts of undergraduate research at Radford University. It is a great opportunity for students to gain valuable career-ready skills and research and leadership experience.

We welcome colleagues with little or much experience with CURES. Faculty members receive a \$2,000 stipend and must commit to an online course development institute this summer, and an all-day kick-off event in August, a small number of meetings during the semester, and data collection and sharing.

The Fulbright U.S. Scholar Program's 2026-2027 competition is officially open!

The competition opening means you now have seven months to write your best application, as the due date will be September 15, 2025, at 5:00 PM EDT (UTC-4:00). While this is a generous amount of time for a grant-writing exercise, perhaps the most important step is this first one you will take: choosing *one* award among the 380+ opportunities for your application. You can only apply for one award per year/competition cycle, so you need to choose wisely.

We encourage you to take a look at <u>the online application</u> and <u>the Application page</u>, which offers plenty of guidance on how to best spend your seven months to write a Fulbright U.S. Scholar application. The application does not require you to work in one sitting, so the sooner you start working online, the sooner you can see your progress.

The job on the Fulbright Scholar Outreach and Recruitment team *is to help you apply*, assisting with everything from award choice to the online application. Waldron College Spring 2025 Interprofessional Case Study Event Engages Over 300 Participants

The Spring 2025 Waldron College Interprofessional Case Study Event brought together 324 participants, including 292 students and 32 faculty and student moderators, for a collaborative learning experience that emphasized teamwork across healthcare and related disciplines. This biannual event is designed to help students engage in interprofessional problem-solving, preparing them for the complexities of team-based patient care.

Participants represented 10 disciplines this semester, including Communication Sciences and Disorders, Occupational Therapy, Physical Therapy, Physician Assistant, Public Health, Respiratory Therapy, and Social Work from Waldron College, as well as Nursing, Medical Laboratory Science, and Music Therapy from across the university. Additionally, 20 students from the Edward Via College of Osteopathic Medicine (VCOM) took part, further enriching the discussions. While participation varies each semester based on availability, the event remains open to all disciplines that can contribute to an interprofessional learning experience.

During the event, students worked in mixed-discipline teams to analyze a complex patient case and also discussed three micro-cases, each designed to highlight interprofessional collaboration in different healthcare scenarios. These cases challenged students to think beyond their own fields, gaining a deeper appreciation for the roles and expertise of other professionals.

Feedback was overwhelmingly positive, with one participant sharing, "I love talking to the other professions and discovering their strengths, specialties, and areas of overlap. It makes me feel valuable and helps me recognize the value of others."

By encouraging interprofessional communication and problem-solving, the Waldron College Interprofessional Case Study Event continues to foster collaboration across disciplines, ensuring that students are well-prepared to work in team-based healthcare settings. The success of this semester's event reinforces the importance of interprofessional education in shaping the future of patient care.


