Academic Calendar Model Finalized

Thank you to the 2,679 survey respondents who provided feedback on Radford University's academic calendar model. You spoke, and we listened. Your feedback from two open forums, senate meetings, survey submissions, and student response boards helped shape Radford University's academic calendar model. The finalized model is available on the <u>Radford University website</u> and the comprehensive 3-year academic calendar will soon be published to the Office of the Registrar webpage.

Department Course Section Change Request

The Radford University's Office of the Registrar is pleased to announce the launch of a new electronic Department Course Section Change Request form, available to all academic departments starting Monday, November 11, 2024. This new digital form, powered by Kuali Build, replaces the former RG-32 Form, allowing departments to streamline course schedule changes, reduce paperwork, and track requests in real-time.

Designed to simplify workflows, the electronic form routes requests through an electronic approval process, sending automatic email confirmation to department administrators once the Registrar's Office has processed the requests.

Office of the Provost now accepting nominations for faculty/staff awards

The Office of the Provost is now accepting nominations for the 2025 Radford University Annual Awards. Nominations for all of the following awards are due by Monday, Dec. 9 at 5 p.m. All faculty and staff are encouraged to nominate deserving colleagues for consideration of these prestigious awards. Recipients will be recommended to Radford University President Bret Danilowicz by the Faculty Awards Committee.

Radford University faculty/staff awards

- <u>The Donald N. Dedmon Distinguished Teaching Professor Award</u>, which recognizes and rewards outstanding teaching.
- <u>The Distinguished Creative Scholar Award</u>, which recognizes significant original contributions to the body of knowledge in academe and rewards contributions that have a significant impact on effective classroom teaching.
- <u>The Distinguished Service Award</u>, which was established to recognize faculty who have contributed substantial service to the university over a sustained period of time.
- <u>The Distinguished Faculty Advising Award</u>, which recognizes and rewards faculty who excel in their role of academic advisors to undergraduate and/or graduate students.
- <u>The Anna Lee Stewart Award for Contributions to Faculty Development</u>, which recognizes faculty and staff who have contributed substantially to the professional development of their colleagues.
- <u>The Award for Administrative and Professional Excellence</u>, which recognizes administrative and professional faculty for distinguished leadership and/or superior service in their area(s) of professional activity within the University.

SCHEV Outstanding Faculty Award

Nominations are also being accepted for the <u>SCHEV Outstanding Faculty Award (OFA)</u>, the highest honor bestowed upon faculty in the Commonwealth of Virginia.

As noted on the SCHEV website, nominees should, "have a demonstrated record of superior accomplishments in teaching, research, knowledge integration and public service" — i.e., in each of Ernest L. Boyer's four types of scholarship. Nominees' accomplishments must be consistent with their university's or college's mission.

Radford SCHEV-OFA Process

Nominees for the OFA will be notified and asked to submit materials (the most recent FAR, current curriculum vitae and a brief statement of accomplishments with respect to OFA criteria) if they wish to be considered for selection as a Radford University OFA nominee. Selected nominees will be contacted in March on the next steps in the process.

To nominate a faculty colleague, submit the name and department/school affiliation of the nominee to Amy Cox, executive administrative assistant to the Associate Provost of Research, Faculty Success & Strategic Initiatives at ofa@radford.edu. Please note that a narrative is not necessary to nominate someone.

Dalton Eminent Scholar Awards

The <u>Dalton Eminent Senior Scholar and Rising Star Awards</u> serve to recognize faculty members with a distinguished national and/or international reputation in their disciplines. Dalton Scholars serve a two-year term which includes \$10,000 award each year (for a total of a \$20,000 award over two years) and expectations for public engagements during their tenure.
