

## **Updates from the Office of the Registrar:**

Radford University recently completed two major routine federal compliance reviews with exemplary results. The Office of the Registrar successfully led both the Department of Defense (DoD) Institutional Compliance Program (ICP) and the Veterans Affairs (VA) Compliance Survey audits. These critical reviews ensure that the university remains compliant with federal requirements and eligible to serve military-affiliated students. These rigorous reviews require extensive coordination and documentation, and we thank our campus partners for their collaborative efforts, including Financial Aid, Bursar's Office, Admissions, Marketing and Communications, Controller's Office, Institutional Research, and Internal Audit. This achievement reflects the university's commitment to supporting our military-affiliated students.

# **OURS Student Seed Grant: Supporting early-stage student research and creative inquiry projects**

OURS is excited to announce the creation of a new way to support student-faculty research across campus in all disciplines! The OURS Student Seed Grant provides up to \$500 to help undergraduate students launch new research projects. This small grant is designed to help you take those first steps exploring a new creative idea.

Any Radford University or Radford University Carilion (RUC) student working on a new mentored undergraduate research project <u>can apply here</u>. Funding must follow guidelines for the use of E&G funds and can be used in a variety of ways, including:

- Project supplies or materials
- Research-related travel
- Software or access fees
- Equipment not available elsewhere on campus

Note: These grants are not intended for existing projects, conference travel, or class assignments. Timeline Applications will be reviewed on a rolling basis, starting at the end of August. We will continue reviewing until all available funds are awarded or February 28, 2026.



## **Capturing Research Expenditures at Radford University**

Radford University actively participates in several national surveys and reports that track research and development (R&D) expenditures. These efforts help ensure that both internally and externally funded research is properly recognized and counted. Research and development is a vital part of supporting innovation, enhancing teaching, and preparing students to meet today's workforce needs. Participating in these surveys not only allows us to benchmark our performance against peer institutions, but also highlights program achievements. To qualify as a research expenditure, the activity must stem from creative and systematic work undertaken with the goal of acquiring new knowledge or applying existing knowledge to develop or improve products, processes, or

systems. With your help, we can ensure that all qualifying activities—whether it's research-related travel, student stipends, or internally funded projects—are accurately captured.

Here's how you can help assist:

- Properly code research expenditures in the Enburse travel system when faculty or students are traveling for research related purposes this includes presenting at conferences.
- If students (undergraduate or graduate) are being paid for participating in research activities, please communicate with the Office of Sponsored Programs at <a href="mailto:tcruise@radford.edu">tcruise@radford.edu</a> so that their office has this information on file.

## Call for Faculty Participation: Institutional Review Board (IRB) – SoTL Expertise Needed

Radford University, like many institutions across the U.S., actively supports and engages in the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (SoTL)—a systemic inquiry into teaching and learning in higher education. These research efforts often yield valuable insights, leading to scholarly publications and contributing to the broader academic community. Because SoTL research frequently involves human participants (e.g., students), it requires approval from the Institutional Review Board (IRB) to ensure ethical and responsible research practices.

The IRB is currently seeking a faculty member—either tenure-track (T/R) or administrative/professional (AP)—with experience in SoTL research to join the committee. This individual would provide valuable insights and help guide the review of SoTL-related protocols, sharing best practices to support the ethical conduct of educational research.
