NCAA Update

House v. NCAA Settlement

- NCAA agreed to a \$2.75 billion dollar settlement to resolve a class-action lawsuit that alleges the NCAA and their restrictions on name, image and likeness (NIL) payments.
- Radford will see a \$275,000 reduction in NCAA distribution each year over the next nine years.

Ray v. NCAA Settlement

- NCAA agreed to a \$303 million dollar settlement to resolve a class-action lawsuit involving former Division I volunteer coaches.
- Radford will see a \$166,000 reduction in NCAA distribution each year for the next three years.

Call to Order

Mr. David Smith, Chair, formally called the meeting to order at 2:28 p.m. in Kyle Hall 340, Radford, Virginia, and welcomed everyone to the Student Affairs and Athletics Committee meeting.

Approval of Agenda

Mr. Smith asked for a motion to approve the September , 2025 meeting agenda as published.
Mr. James Turk so moved, Mr. Dale Ardizzone second and the motion carried unanimously.

Approval of Minutes

Mr. Smith asked for a motion to approve the minutes of the September , 2025 Student Affairs and Athletics Committee meeting as published.
Mr. Anthony Moore so moved, Ms. Callie Dalton seconded, and the motion carried unanimously.

Student Government Association (SGA) Report

Mr. Owen Starr, SGA President, presented an update on SGA progress and initiatives. He reported significant advancement toward membership goals, noting that focused recruitment efforts resulted in 45 active members, all Cabinet roles filled, and all class-specific Senate seats fully occupied.

The SGA Senate continued efforts to amplify student perspectives across the institution. Highlights included the administration of the “*What Do You Want Wednesday?*” (WDYWW) survey, expanded outreach at Radford University Carilion (RUC), and individualized meetings with students to better understand their needs and priorities.

The SGA Cabinet maintained strong emphasis on increasing student engagement and school spirit. Initiatives included coordinating transportation for students to attend Athletic events and implementing a series of engagement-focused programs designed to strengthen campus involvement.

Student Affairs Report

Dr. Susan Trageser, Vice President for Student Affairs, provided an overview of Division-wide progress toward established two-year goals, noting strong advancement in the areas of outdoor experiences, well-being, student employment, and student engagement.

Dr. Trageser shared a highlight video of the 2nd annual Tartan 5K, reporting participation growth from 124 registrations in 2024 to 150 in 2025. Participants expressed overwhelmingly positive feedback, and planning is underway for the third annual event scheduled for Friday, September 18, 2026.

She emphasized the continued focus on cultivating a Culture of Care for both students and staff. Programs such as Fresh Check Day played a vital role in enhancing mental health awareness, connection, and well-being across campus.

Dr. Trageser highlighted the early impact of Connected Communities, the Division's newest unit launched in June 2025. Operated under the guiding message "*come as you are*," the unit centers its work on belonging, identity development, and holistic student support.

Connected Communities celebrated National First-Gen Week with programming honoring first-generation students and their allies. The week concluded with Courage to Rise, a collaborative event with the Military Resource Center to open Veteran's Appreciation Week. She noted that 62% of RU-affiliated military students are first-generation. The unit also continues to offer the Laptop Loaner Program to support students with limited technology access or emergent academic needs.

In alignment with Student Affairs' commitment to expanding student employment, Connected Communities is creating targeted program interventions, strengthening communication strategies, and hiring transfer and commuter students as part-time staff to further engage these populations. Both Connected Communities locations—Heth Hall and Trinkle Hall—have experienced heightened daytime student presence, as well as significant growth in space reservations for student organization meetings, events, and gatherings, including those hosted by faith-based groups.

Dr. Trageser recognized the leadership and intentional efforts of Dr. Shannon Shastry, Director, and Dr. Kristy Wilson, Associate Director, for their work in establishing the early success of Connected Communities.

Lastly, Dr. Trageser reported strong early-semester engagement across Student Affairs programming. Within the first four weeks of the term:

- 97% of first-time students engaged in at least one Student Affairs initiative
- 87% of new transfer students engaged during the same period

Intercollegiate Athletics Report

Mr. Cory Durand, Associate Director of Athletics, provided an overview of Athletics related to facilities and capital improvements, competitive excellence, and important dates and initiatives.

An update was provided on the softball stadium renovation project. The new ASTROTURF artificial softball field has been completed. The remaining components of the project include installation of a new videoboard by Fairplay, scheduled for early January, and installation of new padded walls along the sides and outfield of the stadium. The project is expected to be fully completed prior to the softball team's first home competition, with a grand opening planned for early March.

Several competitive accomplishments across Radford Athletics were highlighted. The Women's Soccer program claimed its seventh Big South Regular Season Championship, all under the leadership of Head Coach Ben Sohrabi. The team advanced to the semifinals of the Big South Tournament and earned multiple postseason honors, including Big South Midfielder of the Year awarded to Lilly Short, Big South Defender of the Year and Big South Newcomer of the Year awarded to Amani Green, Big South Coach of the Year awarded to Ben Sohrabi, and additional Big South All-Conference recognitions for six student-athletes.

Men's Cross Country completed the season with a fifth-place finish in the Big South, and Hayat Khan was recognized as the Big South Scholar-Athlete of the Year. Women's Cross Country finished third

overall, with Delaney Eller earning Big South Newcomer of the Year honors. The Volleyball program concluded the regular season in sixth place and advanced to the semifinals of the Big South Tournament. Men's Soccer finished sixth overall in the Big South. It was noted that Head Coach Chris Barrett has resigned, and the University is currently conducting a national search for the program's next head coach.

Updates were also provided on basketball programs. Men's Basketball currently holds a 3–7 overall record and is scheduled to host several home games during the month of December, including contests against Saint Francis, Coppin State, VMI, and Shenandoah. Women's Basketball currently holds a 5–5 overall record, with remaining non-conference games against Ohio, Concord, Hampton, and Virginia Tech. It was also noted that Head Coach Mike McGuire has achieved the most wins by any head coach in Radford Basketball history, men's or women's.

Lastly, Mr. Durand concluded with several upcoming athletics-related events and initiatives, including Basketball Alumni Weekend on January 24, 2026, which will include an Alumni Volunteer Summit and a men's and women's basketball doubleheader; RAD48, scheduled for February 3–5, 2026; and the Big South Basketball Championship, scheduled for March 4–8, 2026, in Johnson City, Tennessee.

Adjournment

With no further business to come before the committee, Mr. Smith adjourned the meeting at 3:08 p.m.
