- <sup>5</sup> This class will fulfill the Scientific and Quantitative Reasoning (R) requirement for REAL.
- <sup>6</sup> Students interested in earning a Bachelor of Arts degree will need to take 6-8 credits of foreign language.
- <sup>7</sup> The Department of Criminal Justice offers minors in Conservation Law Enforcement, Crime Analysis, and Forensic Studies, but students often earn minors from other departments, such as psychology or sociology. ### **Other Notes**

In order to receive a Bachelor's degree in Criminal Justice from Radford University, students must complete 120 credit hours. Students must complete at least 30 hours at Radford University, including at least half of the hours in the Criminal Justice major. For any course to count for transfer, it must be completed with a grade of "C" or higher.
