² These courses count toward the Bachelor of Arts component of the Psychology major.

³ Fulfills a Radford University Psychology Major Requirement.

⁴ MTH-155 is listed in the VWCC program of study, but it also indicates that students "may substitute any higher-level mathematics course." The course identified here transfers to Radford University as STAT-200, which is a required course for Psychology majors. MTH 155 transfers as STAT 130, which will not satisfy the requirements for psychology.

⁵ Courses recommended for one of two social science electives are those which transfer to Radford University as either PSYC-230 or PSYC-317 which fulfills the Developmental Core required for Psychology majors.

⁶ Course recommended for one general elective are those which transfer to Radford University as either PSYC-343 or PSYC-361 which fulfills the Social/Cultural Core required for Psychology majors.

Satisfying the Radford University Core Curriculum (general education) Program

In accordance with the State Policy on Transfer, students who transfer to Radford University from a Virginia Community College will have satisfied Radford University's Core Curriculum **if they have earned an Associate of Arts degree in Liberal Studies from a Virginia Community College**; or the student is able to earn such a degree by successfully completing the remaining requirements before completing a bachelor's degree at Radford University.

Other Notes

In order to receive a Bachelor's degree in Psychology from Radford University, students must complete 120 credit hours. Students must complete at least 45 hours at Radford University, including at least half of the hours in the Psychology major.
