

ENTREPRENEURSHIP MINOR

The minor in Entrepreneurship is open to all students except Management majors. It is designed to provide students with the complementary skills needed to effectively create and manage business opportunities associated with their primary discipline (e.g. art gallery, boutique, online music business, healthcare services, professional services practice, private security agency, technology start-up, non-profit social services, and many more).
