Satisfying the Radford University Core Curriculum (general education) Program

In accordance with the State Policy on Transfer, students who transfer to Radford University from a Virginia Community College will have satisfied Radford University's Core Curriculum **if they have earned an Associate of Arts degree in Liberal Arts**; if they are able to earn such a degree by successfully completing at a Virginia Community College courses remaining for the degree concurrently with the first semester of enrollment at Radford University; or if they will earn the associate's degree as a result of credit earned during the first semester of enrollment at Radford University, up to a maximum of 10 hours.

Other Notes

In order to receive a Bachelor's degree in Foreign Languages & Literatures from Radford University, students must complete 120 credit hours. Students must complete at least 45 hours at Radford University, including at least half of the hours in the Foreign Languages & Literatures major, and 30 of the last 39 credit hours must be completed at Radford University. Radford University offers a Bachelor of Science degree in Foreign Languages & Literatures (Modern Foreign Language concentration) with teacher licensure in the Spanish language. The licensure option satisfies the additional minor and/or major requirement associated with all Foreign Language majors at Radford University. Students must also complete a Study Abroad or Intensive Immersion Experience. Additional information is available in the Radford University Undergraduate Catalog. Additional information about transferring to Radford University is available from the Office of Admissions. For any course to count for transfer, it must be completed with a grade of "C" or higher.
