#### Overview

Illness, disability, medicine, and caretaking cut across academic disciplines, and being knowledgeable in the cultural, socio-economic, emotional, and political aspects of health can prepare one to be a productive and successful professional, civic leader, community member, and citizen of a globalized world.

The Health Humanities minor enables all students, regardless of major or career goal, to formalize the interdisciplinary study of illness, disability, medicine, and caretaking. Students pursuing the health humanities minor are introduced to the health humanities through two required courses: ENGL/HHUM 210: Narratives of Illness, Disability, and Caretaking (3 credits) and PHIL 215: Bioethics (3 credits). A required capstone course (HHUM 410 or HHUM 498) encourages students to synthesize, apply, and reflect on their learning experience at the conclusion of their studies.

Students who want to pursue the Health Humanities minor must submit a "Declaration of Major/Minor" form; this form is available through the Office of Registrar.

Students pursuing the Health Humanities minor also must consult with the Coordinator of the Health Humanities minor (or a program representative) during the advising period for Fall and Spring semesters.

#### **Curricular Tracks**

The minor offers two tracks to better accommodate students' needs: "Track 1" (18-19 credit hours) and "Track 2" (18-19 credit hours).

Track 1 is open to all students except for Pre-Nursing and Nursing majors.

Additional information for REAL Council consideration: It is important for Track 2 of the minor to allow some students to take the capstone course, HHUM 498, for 1-2 credits. For instance, some students may be engaged in clinical or professional placements during the semester in which they elect to take HHUM 498, and as such, an additional 3-credit course may put them over a specific tuition threshold. Some students engaged in clinical or professional placements while taking HHUM 498 also may be concerned about workload. Ultimately, the 1-3 credit option for HHUM 498 ensures that the minor is both affordable and feasible for students in programs like nursing, public health, etc. Importantly, as demonstrated above, students who take HHUM 498 for fewer than 3 credits will still be able to use the minor to fulfill the "E" area. They can do this by taking one of the six courses identified above (i.e., ENGL 309, 310, 311, 312; RELN 381; PHIL 430). These choices allows students to simultaneously fulfill an elective requirement for the health humanities minor as well as a requirement for the "E" area designation (i.e., 3 "E" credits at the 300-level or higher). Given the frequency of these offerings, a student who needs to take one of these classes (to fulfill the "E" area) can easily do so. *Please note that the upcoming academic catalog entry for the minor will include this information about electives for students taking HHUM 498 for fewer than 3 credits.*
