The B.S. in Art, with a concentration in Studio Art, has several pathways and is intended for students who are interested in art but who do not plan on pursuing a career as a professional artist. The goal of this degree is to prepare students to pursue either graduate work or career opportunities in art-related disciplines where the B.F.A. degree and/or educational licensure is not required. These areas might include material cultural studies, forensic arts, art therapy, recreational use of art in extracurricular educational settings, or marketing and business. Students in any concentration within the art department must receive a grade of C or better in any course that counts toward the major.

Description of learning outcome assessment plan: Because non-western traditions are potentially very different from western, this class generally involves the creation of art works in the style of the region studied in class; they may be displayed in a class exhibition; projects involve a written paper analyzing the meaning of creative expression in this culture; their own creatives are self-evaluated and evaluated in art foundations classes
