Six semester hours of 2-dimensional (2-D) studio courses. Six semester hours of 3-dimensional (3-D) studio courses. Nine additional hours selected from 2-D or 3-D studio courses.

General Electives

It is recommended that the remaining credit hours be taken in a discipline relevant to one of the five pathways: education without licensure, material culture, entrepreneurship, therapeutic sciences, or interdisciplinary arts. These areas include: psychology, criminal justice, business, sociology or anthropology, theater, music, dance, or recreational therapy. Students should consult their advisors in selecting elective courses to complete the 120 hours required for graduation possibly using a second minor in addition to or in place of free electives.

B.S. degree requirements of 6 – 10 credits outside major will be fulfilled by cornerstone foundations for the REAL curriculum 60 credits fulfill E and A REAL alignments, art core and BS degree;

Most students in this degree option choose to double major. They do not participate in the final exhibition that is required for the BFA students.
