Dr. Shuo Yao, Professor, School of Communication

<u>Project Title:</u> Towards Large-Scale Human-Al Interactive
Curriculum Generations for Online Learning

Dr. Yao is a Professor and Graduate Program Coordinator in the School of Communication, whose teaching and research areas focus on societal expectations of organizational legitimacy. She explores public opinions through traditional survey, content analysis of media reports and social media data analysis. Dr. Yao's current project is in collaboration with

faculty in the Department of Computer Science at Virginia Tech who have received external grant funding from the Commonwealth Cyber Initiative (CCI). Their project aims to develop a human-AI interactive curriculum generation framework for labor-optimized and trustworthy online learning platforms. Online learning is a high-impact and emerging application domain for cybersecurity researchers, which naturally operates interactively between humans and machines.

The proposed framework is composed of three key modules, including (M1) Human Interaction Comprehension that aims to automatically comprehend human interactions (e.g., teachers' evaluations and students' feedbacks) for further improving the online learning platforms; (M2) Personalized Machine Teaching that generates a personalized curriculum for various students by leveraging the existing human developed curriculum and comprehending the users' interactions in M1; and (M3) Curriculum Auditing that allows educators to supervise and audit the curriculum generation process to ensure a secure online learning experience. Dr. Yao is currently working with the project team in the mechanism design and evaluation of curriculum generation. They plan to present their work at the upcoming CCI symposium.

Humanities Initiatives (NEH) Humanities Initiatives strengthen the teaching and study of the humanities at institutions of higher education by developing new or enhancing existing programs, resources (including those in digital format), or courses that explore, interpret, and preserve the diversity of human cultures, ideas, and practices, past and present. Projects must address a core topic or set of themes drawn from humanities areas such as history, philosophy, religion, literature, or humanities-informed composition and writing skills.
