## **Faculty Spotlight**

Dr. Alexander Eaton, Assistant Professor, Department of Chemistry at RUC

Project Title: Synthesis of Non-burning Capsaicin Derivatives



Capsaicin, the active component of chili peppers, is a spice commonly found in many foods enjoyed worldwide. Even though some may find the spice painful to consume, studies have shown capsaicin is effective in pain treatment. Capsaicin creams are available over the counter and used for the management of pain caused by neuralgia, rheumatoid arthritis, or muscle sprains and strains. However, due to capsaicin causing a burning sensation on the skin, non-burning creams containing capsaicin prodrugs show the potential to provide pain relief without the unpleasant burning sensation. Capsaicin palmitate cream, which has previously been

marketed, is being redeveloped by Chorda Pharma, a small startup business in Roanoke, VA. To create a more potent, non-burning capsaicin cream, alternative molecules are being explored and synthesized. As part of Dr. Eaton's research with Chorda Pharma, dicapsaicin esters will be synthesized by undergraduate students at Radford University Carilion. These derivatives have the potential to deliver capsaicin in a higher concentration while still not causing a burning sensation. Synthesizing capsaicin palmitate and dicapsaicin allows student researchers to familiarize themselves with techniques, glassware, chemicals, and instrumentation. The current synthesis and TLC analysis is being performed in the chemistry lab at RUC, with other products being analyzed using instrumentation available at the Radford University Chemistry Department.

## Faculty-Student Success

In late September 2022, Research Rookie Lauren Griffin, a sophomore majoring in Cybersecurity, received an invitation from her research mentor, Dr. 'Shawn Smith, Associate Professor of Criminal Justice to present her research on digital literacy for persons under the age of 18, to the 1st annual Cybersecurity, Education, and Research Conference of the Commonwealth and Coastal VA, held at the College of William and Mary. Lauren and Dr. Smith used resources like the



**SMART Lab** to investigate the Twitterverse relating to the mass shootings of Robb Elementary School and the Buffalo shooting of 2022.

### RCS Survey Highlights

In Spring 2022, we conducted a faculty Research & Creative Scholarship Survey. Over the course of our newsletters this year, we will share data from the survey. In this issue, we look at the results when we asked faculty to respond to the question: *Please finish this sentence: "In my discipline, research and creative scholarship is defined as..."* The word cloud below visually shares the results:



Of the 101 colleagues who responded to this question, they focused primarily on the products of their work (55%) and secondarily on the activity of inquiry, discovery, and creativity (23%). These responses offer a window into our collective thinking.
