Cheri Derbin, Financial Aid, spoke about Foundation scholarship application process and database software "apply to" scholarship extra step, help students understand the value of these scholarships, Academic Works is the software to help the students with a single sign on process to allow them to be considered for all eligible scholarships that apply to their qualifications. Staff Senate Foundation Endowed Scholarship is a "apply to" scholarship which requires a few simple questions to be answered. Working with Advancement and asking questions about how donors may choose to contribute to the Staff Senate Scholarship directly. Process begins December 1, 2018. Look each semester at scholarships unfulfilled which need to be reassigned. Beginning the 2019-2020 scholarship cycle. Will close approximately February 2019. Watch parent communication, website, and other PR. Had about 1.6 million dollars to award for over 100 scholarships. Staff senate met with Cheri Durbin in the 2018-2019 academic year, had direct input in the selection of the award recipient. Had a discussion about splitting the scholarship but ultimately decided it would be most beneficial to support one student and his family – who must be a relative of a current Radford University staff member.

Diane and William Nape, Center for Diversity and Inclusion staff member and son, Radford University Student and Staff Senate Foundation Scholarship 2018-2019 recipient. Diane works in Center for Diversity and Inclusion – knew about scholarships, encouraged William, and close to Financial Aid office realized the opportunity for her students, promotes it widely. Sophomore – studying Math and Chemistry with a focus now on Chinese. Wants to be a doctor post grad become a surgeon – personal impact on his family with major medical and he wants to give back. Has had the fortune to have healthy emotional support from his family. The financial support from this scholarship and one other has helped keep him motivated. Parental support is expected and intrinsic. Having an outside party support your dreams and goals is validating. Also received the Kirk Fellowship, allows student to attend a language and culture class for credit and then tour China and experience it first-hand. Has had a personal fascination about Asian culture and took a chance, honored to have received the opportunity. Currently taking 1st language class now, will take a language and culture class in spring. Then will travel to China, only required to raise \$500 to cover his cost associated with the Kirk program. Kirk scholarship requires an essay. Feels he can help many people by having connections with his future patients and believes that he will be better able to do this by learning about other cultures and studying the language of another community. Feels these skills will allow him to be best able to make a difference in the world and help comfort his patients. Beyond his general curiosity and self-fulfillment. Looking forward to future opportunities that will come to him in the world, going back to China and giving
