# Radford University/Radford City Joint Commission Minutes

## The Hub on East Main Street April 8, 2025 @ 8:30 am

#### I. Welcome

The meeting was opened by Co-chairs, Angela Joyner and Kellie Artrip, who welcomed everyone to the meeting.

### II. East Main Street project update

Angela Joyner updated the members about the East Main Street storefront project that is in the works with Radford University students, Taylor Hollow Construction, Radford Economic Development and Radford Chamber of Commerce. This project helps support a recommendation from DHCD study of East Main Street. Radford University design students, under the direction of Laura Kimball, developed restaurant and retail concepts for properties on East Main. A reception showcased these designs with a second round of retail concepts scheduled for later this month. Council members were encouraged to view the project firsthand and will receive an invitation. #### III. Student housing update

Radford University hosted a student housing roundtable with local property managers. Susan Trageser reported on discussions with local property managers regarding student housing. Due to strong enrollment and retention rates, approximately 300 upperclassmen will need off-campus housing. A housing fair will be held on April 16<sup>th</sup> at noon – 1:30 pm on the Bonnie Plaza. ## IV. Memorandum of Agreement (MOA) process

Memorandum of Agreements (MOA) between the City of Radford and Radford University are being developed. The Highlander Festival and Community Fest agreements will be the first agreements to go through the collaboratively developed process. A joint committee will work together to develop the MOA's and share with Joint Commission.

The Highlander Festival is scheduled for September 13<sup>th</sup>. Homecoming is scheduled for October 9 - 11. A meeting will be coordinated with the committee to develop MOAs and processes. ## V. City Budget & University Implications/opportunities

Interim City Manager Craig Meadows outlined the city's current budget. He mentioned an increase in energy bills, revenue projections and other factors have contributed to the current budget. Several proposed actions including tax increases, budget cuts, hiring freezes and increasing rates for services are some of the tactics under consideration. A public budget hearing is scheduled for next Monday, April 14<sup>th</sup> at 6 pm with a second budget reading planned for April 21st.

#### VI. General Discussion

The group discussed opportunities to continue to partner together, work creatively on identifying solutions and sharing how each partner is currently supporting each other (financially, projects, volunteerism, economic impact, employment, housing). Citizens may be unaware of the university's contributions. All agreed that the success of both the university and the city is interconnected, and the importance of community engagement in the university's strategic planning was emphasized.
