




Q7 - What portion of your clients are from families with an income below the average of the community in which you work?


Q8 - What segment of clients with whom you work are from ethnically and culturally diverse families?


Q9 - What was your area of counseling specialization in Counselor Education?





What can the Department of Counselor Education do to better prepare our students as counselors?

I think a year of continuing supervision after graduation would be very beneficial.

More practical hands on and less aspirational teaching. More in case management and other areas outside of talk therapy

Encourage more writing and research. Encourage the thesis paper rather the comps examination.

Have more of a focus on treatment planning, and Community work.

We observed quite a bit of changes while in the program. While flexibility is a major tenet of a budding counselor the numerous changes we observed did make it more difficult in adhering to the program. I understand the changes are for the better, I just wish I would have been in the program after the changes had been made. I think more devotion to the actual day to day duties of a counselor would be beneficial. Such as learning an EHS (credible is extremely prevalent in this area). And further exploring what counselors in the area are doing with their education. I think communication remained a constant barrier for both students and faculty. I understand that communication will always be a barrier (my lateness on getting this survey back to you for example). However, there were instances throughout the program in which more communication on how the changes going on could potential effect students. The dropping of grief and loss resulting in faculty taking on additional stress for the sake of everyone graduating on time comes to mind.

More exposure, acknowledgment and training of the many non-counseling requirements that will inevitably be expected of the counselor.

More direction in students' personal career development within the counseling field and assistance in finding internship placements that coincide with career interests.

Data and how to collect it, implement, it etc. That is the only thing I feel like id did not get a good knowledge base of.

Provide more instruction about some of the other duties school counselors are in charge of.

Orientations were held during the 1st and 2nd semesters. An orientation held in the second year that focused on licensing preparation and other miscellaneous graduation and post graduation related needs would have made a large difference. Thankfully, Dr. Davis was able to help us with this in Advanced CMHC course.

I would suggest more focus on procedural, real world application of notes/insurance protocols/office norms. Also, more staff to accommodate the growing cohorts.

Bringing in more information on resources in the area for potential employment and internship.

To utilize community resources to introduce the students to advance forms of therapy, such as NRVCS. Utilize gate-keeping responsibilities, when needed; possibly take in the opinion of the cohort.

Provide more on diagnosis criteria.

Offer more course times and putting more awareness into students who may need to be slowed down in the program (improve gatekeeping).

I would have liked for the NCE to have been part of our program.

Offer more courses for specialized degrees. I.e. Gerontology, CSAC, Human Sexuality.


Increase community integration with agencies for students to experience more hands on work. Discontinue use of weekend classes for summer speciality courses and increase to full length classes to increase breath of course information.

More information on the types of jobs counselors will likely take pre licensure. Additionally, more information on what residency requirements and the residency experience is like.

Most school counselors are now in charge of 504's and SOL's. I also register students and deal with some difficult custody documents. If there is someone to educate students on those responsibilities.


