Attendance Policy for the Virginia Governor's School for Visual & Performing Arts and the Humanities

This policy aims to ensure that students maximize their learning opportunities and maintain a high level of commitment to the program.

1. Mandatory Attendance

- **Full Participation**: Students must attend all classes, lectures, workshops, performances, and cocurricular activities. Absences will only be excused under exceptional circumstances.
- **Punctuality**: Students must arrive on time for all scheduled events. Tardiness will be recorded and may result in disciplinary action.

2. Excused Absences

- **Medical Emergencies**: Absences due to medical emergencies or illnesses will only be excused if supported by a note from a healthcare provider.
- **Family Emergencies**: Travel off campus must be approved by one of the Directors of the Governor's School. Absences due to family emergencies must be verified by a parent or guardian.
- **Religious Observances**: Travel off the campus for religious purposes is not permitted. Travel off campus is approved only in exceptional circumstances, such as family emergencies and court appearances.

3. Unexcused Absences

- **Consequences**: Unexcused absences will result in the following consequences:
 - 1. **First and Second Offenses**: A verbal warning will be issued to the student.
 - 2. **Third and Fourth Offenses**: A mandatory meeting with a Resident Life Manager or Program coordinator and a follow-up telephone call to the parent/guardian.
 - 3. **Fifth Offense**: A mandatory meeting with a director of the Governor's School.
 - 4. **Sixth and Seventh Offenses:** A written warning will be issued to the student, and their parents/guardians and school counselors will be notified in writing.
 - 5. **Eighth Offense**: The student will be dismissed from the Governor's School without a refund.

4. Tardiness

- **Consequences**: Repeated tardiness will be treated as follows:
 - 1. First and Second Offenses: A verbal warning from the counselor or instructor.
 - 2. Third Offense: A more severe verbal warning from the counselor or instructor.
 - 3. **Fourth Offense**: A mandatory meeting with the Resident Life Manager or Program Coordinator, which may result in a follow-up call to the parent/guardian.

- 4. **Fifth Offense**: A mandatory meeting with a director of the Governor's School.
- 5. **Sixth and Seventh Offenses:** A written warning will be issued to the student, and their parents/guardians and school counselors will be notified in writing.
- 6. **Eighth Offense:** The student may <u>not</u> be issued a certificate of completion of the program, which is reserved for students who have completed the program without serious infractions.

5. Notification Procedure

- **Absence Notification**: Students must notify their counselor and instructor promptly if they are or will be absent. Notifications should be made via email or verbally in a phone call.
- **Parental and School Counselor Notification**: Parents/guardians and the student's guidance counselor will be notified of habitual unexcused absences or repeated tardiness.

6. Make-Up Work

- **Responsibility**: Students are responsible for completing any missed work due to excused absences. Instructors will provide make-up assignments or alternative work as appropriate.
- **Deadlines**: Make-up work must be completed within the deadlines for the assignment.

7. Attendance Tracking

- **Daily Records**: Attendance will be taken at the beginning of each class or activity. Students are responsible for signing in via a QR code, as required for each class meeting.
- **Review**: Attendance records will be reviewed weekly by the Resident Life Managers and Program Coordinators.

8. Disciplinary Action

- **Process**: Disciplinary actions will be documented and kept on file. Repeated violations will result in calibrated interventions that may culminate in verbal and written warnings, calls and letters to parents/guardians and the school counselors, and even dismissal from the program.
- **Appeals**: Students may appeal against any disciplinary action by submitting a written request to the Resident Life Managers and Program Coordinator within 48 hours of the action.

9. Compliance

• **Agreement**: By enrolling in the Virginia Governor's School for Visual & Performing Arts and the Humanities, students and their parents/guardians agree to comply with this attendance policy.
