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## Faculty Spotlight

**Dr. Naveen Joseph, Ph.D., Principal Investigator, Assistant Professor, Geospatial Science**

**Project Title:** *Geospatial Analysis of Food Insecurity and Adverse Human Health Outcomes in the United States*

**About Dr. Naveen Joseph**

Dr. Naveen Joseph is an Assistant Professor of Geospatial Science at Radford University. He did his Masters in Hydraulics and Water Resources Engineering from the Indian Institute of Technology, Madras, India, and his Ph.D. in Environmental Hydrology and Water Resources from the University of Melbourne, Australia. He also worked at the Idaho Water Resources Research Institute, University of Idaho as a postdoctoral research fellow. Dr. Joseph's research interests focus on understanding the interactions among humans, the geospatial environment in which they live, time, and public health. He primarily uses geospatial datasets, statistical tools, and hydrological models to address the water resources issues both at regional and nationwide scales.

**Abstract**

Dr. Joseph successfully won a Seed Grant aimed to evaluate the associations between environmental contaminants, socioeconomic factors (including food insecurity), and climate variables with adverse human health outcomes (diabetes, cancer, cardiovascular disease) across the contiguous United States. The specific objectives outlined in the original proposal were: a) Aim 1: Compile datasets on food security, pesticide usage, climate variables, and health outcomes. b) Aim 2: Develop consolidated indices of environmental, socioeconomic, and climate factors using multivariate statistical techniques. c) Aim 3: Quantify associations between these indices and adverse human health outcomes at county and state scales. After completing his project, Dr. Joseph was able to publish his data in a scientific journal.

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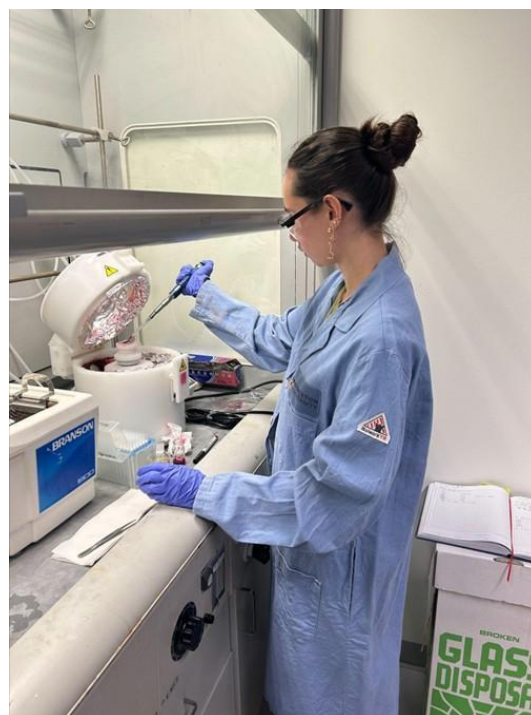
# Student Success

## Student Research Sparks a Summer of Discovery at Princeton

Chemistry Professor, Tim Fuhrer had a summer to remember after securing both internal and external funding for four research students across two states. As Fuhrer discussed managing the projects with half of his team working remotely, he shared, "Amelia Naegele and Morgan Buskill were supported by a Radford University SURF (Summer Undergraduate Research Fellowship) and worked out the predictive computational models that supported our cavity quantum

electrodynamics experimental work". He then had the other half joining him at Princeton to perform the theoretical work that would ideally validate the computational modeling being done back at Radford University. "Athena Smith and Fiona Steinour were immersed in the experimental work of mirror cavity fabrication as well as spectroscopic data collection and analysis", Fuhrer said.

As part of this work, Athena was challenged with finding ways to collect data that only lasted for as little as 7 nanoseconds! Reflecting on the experience, Athena added, "Being part of a lab at Princeton gave me the chance to learn techniques that I had only read about before. It was exciting to not only gain new skills but also contribute meaningful results to an ongoing research project."

Her mentor, Tim Fuhrer, was equally positive reflecting on the summer "Their curiosity, persistence, and creativity push the project forward in ways that are both rewarding and inspiring as a faculty mentor. Watching Athena and her peers immerse themselves in the experimental work reminded me why I love guiding students through research - because I learn just as much from them as they do from me."

Fuhrer summarized the importance of these opportunities by sharing "I learned more this summer working with these four students than I did in any semester of college or graduate school, so I can only imagine how much my students learned, not only about our own project, but about how science is done in the best cases."

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## Research Resources

### Open Article Publishing without the Author Publishing Costs (APCs)

Publishing in open access journals helps you reach a broader audience by eliminating paywalls to support open science. However, the author publishing costs (APCs) for many Gold and Hybrid open journal types can be prohibitively expensive unless you've rolled funding the APCs into a successful grant.

Fortunately, there is another way to get your APCs covered. Check if Radford University Libraries has a publisher agreement with the journal before submitting. If you follow guidelines, you may be able to publish open access with no APCs in gold open journals by many of the following publishers:

- American Chemical Society (ACS)
- Association for Computing Machinery (ACM)
- Cambridge University Press (CUP)
- Institute of Physics (IOP)
- International Water Association (IWA)
- PLOS
- Rockefeller University Press (RUP)
- Springer Nature
- Wiley

This is possible through our Libraries membership in VIVA, the Virginia Academic Libraries Consortium. We have Research Librarians available to help you find out if the journal you're submitting to qualifies, and if so, to make sure that you are submitting the paper according to the guidelines VIVA has set out. This ensures that your work will be published open wherever possible. VIVA prioritizes Gold journals over Hybrid, but will fund Hybrid as funds permit.

### Faculty Professional Development Leave Program

The Radford University Faculty Professional Development Leave Program provides tenured faculty an opportunity to engage in advanced study, research, and/or other scholarly and creative activities that will enhance their competencies as teachers/scholars and better prepare them to fulfill their teaching and other professional obligations to the university. This program supports traditional forms of professional development as well as alternative opportunities that would enable a faculty member to intern with a company, agency, school, or other such entity in order to enhance, reestablish, or re-energize their research, scholarship, or creative activity in their area of professional practice. Leave may be requested at full pay for one semester or at one-half pay for two semesters, according to the terms specified in the Faculty Handbook.

## Institutional Review Board (IRB) - SoTL Expertise Needed

Radford University, like many institutions across the U.S., actively supports and engages in the Scholarship of Teaching and Learning (SoTL) - a systemic inquiry into teaching and learning in higher education. These research efforts often yield valuable insights, leading to scholarly publications and contributing to the broader academic community. Because SoTL research frequently involves human participants (e.g., students), it requires approval from the Institutional Review Board (IRB) to ensure ethical and responsible research practices.

The IRB is currently seeking a **faculty member** - either tenure-track (T/R) or administrative/professional (AP) - with experience in SoTL research to join the committee. This individual would provide valuable insights and help guide the review of SoTL-related protocols, sharing best practices to support ethical conduct of educational research.

## The SMART Lab: Where Curiosity Is Transformed into Discovery

The Social Media Analytics & Research Technology (SMART) Lab at Radford University provides a dedicated space for student and faculty researchers to bring ideas to life. Whether beginning a class project or preparing a conference presentation, the lab offers the tools, training, and support to move work forward.

Researchers have access to advanced programs, including Meltwater, NVivo, NodeXL, Qualtrics, Tableau, SPSS, Mentimeter, LIWC-22, and MindMeister. These resources enable the collection of large datasets from online and traditional media, the analysis and visualization of results, and the application of advanced techniques such as social network and semantic network analysis. The SMART Lab supports both quantitative and qualitative research, with consultations available for brainstorming, research design, data collection, and analysis. Training also extends to emerging areas such as prompt engineering and the ethical use of AI. Faculty are encouraged to schedule full-class demonstrations to introduce students to the lab's resources.

Located in Hemphill Hall 3021, the SMART Lab is directed by Dr. John Brummette with graduate assistants, Kirsten Cecil, Hanna Phipps, and Constance Olle. Open Monday through Thursday from 9 a.m. to 4 p.m., the lab is ready to help you take your research to the next level!

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## Coming Soon

### Data Management Plan

Sponsored Programs is in the process of updating our website to provide helpful resources for researchers who need assistance with the development of a **data management plan (DMP)**. Included on our website will be access to a SMP Tool which is free, open-source, online application that helps researchers create DMPs. The DMP Tool provides a click-through wizard for creating a data plan that complies with funders' requirements.

Many funding agencies require data management plans as part of a grant proposal application. Even if you are not seeking funding for your research, documenting a plan for your data is always the best practice so Sponsored Programs will soon have valuable resources on our website at your disposal!
